# We will do it - together! Message from the President: Jose Roberto 'Robbie' Guevara

We have always believed that we are living in a very dynamic world – where change is the only constant. And we have advocated that adult learning and education plays an important role in helping individuals and communities not just adapt to the change but be part of helping to make change.

I cannot think of a more challenging time for our global adult education movement when we are confronted by what we can characterize as multiple, complex and interconnected crises – protracted conflicts; extreme poverty amidst a growing number of billionaires; rapid development of communication technologies, like AI and social media, and the accompanying spread of misand dis-information, the reality of exceeding 1.5 degrees Celsius of global warming, and the growth of democratically elected authoritarian governments.

However, amidst these global realities, the title of the most recent <u>OECD</u> Report (more commonly called PIAAC) of the Survey of Adult Skills 2023, asked the question "Do adults have the skills they need to thrive in this changing world?" And they came to an alarming conclusion – "Literacy and numeracy skills among adults have largely declined or stagnated over the past decade in most OECD countries. … Declines have been even larger and more widespread among low-educated adults." (<u>OECD press release</u>, 10 Dec 2024)


This is alarming because the proficiency of adults in literacy, numeracy and adaptive problem solving are "key information-processing skills that both individuals and societies need to thrive. ... Skills help adults manage and embrace complexity in both private and civic spheres. Skilled adults can better navigate the modern information landscape, thereby contributing to more informed collective decision making and policy choices." (from the Executive Summary, 10 Dec 2024)

The ICAE has always had a commitment to Transformative Learning – a commitment that has two dimensions. First, is the more recognizable role of learning for transformation – where we, as civil society organizations, deliver and advocate for learning that transforms the lives of individuals and societies, where learning helps to transform our world. The second, is often less recognizable and more challenging, that as educators and advocates we commit to transform ourselves, our educational practice, and the very organizations that support our work, to develop the capacity of our learners to effectively engage with this dynamically changing world.

2025 welcomes us with these dual challenging realities – a declining adult literacy and numeracy skills that is essential if adults are to effectively understand and navigate the complex and interconnected crises of our dynamic world.

2025 also welcomes us with the recognition that as ICAE we are ready to face these challenges. We have the global policy framework that we all worked together to achieve – the Marrakesh Framework for Action. We have strong strategic partnerships with the likes of the UNESCO, and the UNESCO Institute for Lifelong Learning (UIL), and the Education and Academic Stakeholder Group in the UN. But more importantly we have you – our members, representing regional and national networks of educators and advocates, who are all committed and actively engaged in pursuing transformative lifelong and life wide learning.

We are counting on each one of you – together we shall learn, together we shall advocate and together we shall transform ourselves to face these challenges, and achieve a more just, equitable, healthy, gender-fair and sustainable world – for all.



## Training of Trainers on the GlobALE Curriculum in Benin by Carole Avande Houndjo, ICAE Vice President for Africa

From November 18–22, 2024, Pamoja Network, with the support of DVV International, hosted a **Training of Trainers on the GlobALE Curriculum** in Grand-Popo, Benin. The event brought together 17 participants from Benin, Burkina Faso, Côte d'Ivoire, Ghana, Mali, Niger, Nigeria, and Togo.

The GlobALE Curriculum, an international framework designed by UNESCO, comprises five modules. This training focused on **Module 1**, revisiting key concepts such as learning pillars, major educational theories, and the role of social movements in adult education.

Participants also explored themes including the influence of international organizations, decision-making processes, education policies, funding tools, and challenges in adult education governance and financing.

This collaborative effort strengthened the participants' capacities, fostering cross-regional engagement and advocacy for adult education.



## **Education Champions Honored in West Africa**

In 2024, the **Concours des Champions de l'Éducation** was held to identify and honor exceptional contributions to the education sector in West Africa. Supported financially by the **Swiss Cooperation**, the competition highlighted innovative practices and impactful projects in education.

Following a rigorous selection process, three outstanding organizations from **Benin**, **Burkina Faso**, **and Senegal** were awarded for their remarkable achievements. These champions exemplified excellence and innovation in advancing education across the region.

The awards ceremony took place in **December 2024**, celebrating the winners and their contributions to the field of education. This initiative underscored the importance of collaboration and investment in education to inspire progress and innovation.

## ASPBAE 9th General Assembly and 60th Anniversary Concludes in a Joyful and Inspiring Celebration in Vietnam by Helen Dabu, Secretary General ASPBAE

The Asia South Pacific Association for Basic and Adult Education (ASPBAE) 9th General Assembly Regional Strategic Planning Workshop and 60th Anniversary celebration culminated on November 25-28 in Da Nang, Vietnam, bringing together more than a hundred representatives of ASPBAE members and partners from around 30 countries.

Hosted by ASPBAE's member, the Vietnam Association for Education for All

(VAEFA), the consultative discussions and capacity building sessions embedded in this milestone event were guided by the theme "60 Years of Learning and Acting Together: For a Peaceful, Inclusive, Gender-Just, and Climate-Ready Future for All."

The ASPBAE Secretary-General, Helen Dabu, framed the opening ceremony taking inspiration from a local Vietnamese proverb which states "When eating fruit, remember who planted the tree". For the Vietnamese context and culture, it is a constant reminder for them to be grateful to everyone who contributes to their lives. In the same vein, ASPBAE's journey of 60 years produced transformative good fruits, and this is a moment to celebrate and appreciate those who planted the ASPBAE tree and the collective journey of members, Executive Council, staff and partners who continue to nurture ASPBAE.

Further, the ASPBAE President and ICAE Vice-President for Asia Pacific, Nani Zulminarni, warmly welcomed the ASPBAE members and partners, emphasizing the importance of building capacities to advocate for the education rights of marginalized groups and sustaining a strong voice to advance the learning needs and interests of all, especially marginalized children, youth and adults in the region.

With ASPBAE being a founding member of ICAE, and one of the most enduring civil society regional networks advancing transformative adult learning and education (ALE), this event also included a dedicated plenary session on "Reinforcing a Rights-Based Approach to ALE within a Lifelong Learning (LLL) Framework," with a framing input on 'Transforming Adult Learning and Education Through System Building Approach (ALESBA)' provided by Uwe Gartenschlaeger, the Director of DVV International and ICAE Executive Committee Member.


The last day of the programme featured a session entitled "Sustaining our Movements for Education at National, Regional, and Global Levels: A commemorative reflection inspired by ASPBAE leaders who have passed on since the 50th Anniversary." Among others, this included an input from ASPBAE's Consulting Director for Policy and Strategic Directions, and former Secretary-General from 1995 to 2020, Maria Khan, recalling those who have contributed to what ASPBAE has become, an organisation able to dare strive for a future where it remains relevant, credible and powerful. Closing and

synthesising insights for this movement-building session were also provided by Dr. Jose Roberto Guevara, the President of ICAE, who joined the discussion via Zoom platform.

As part of the Assembly, the new Executive Council (EC) for the term 2025-2028 was inducted. The incoming ASPBAE President, Peter Clinton from the Adult and Community Education (ACE) Aotearoa, New Zealand, was introduced and recognized for his leadership.

## New PIAAC Results Highlight Challenges for Adult Education

The latest findings from the <u>Programme for the International Assessment of Adult Competencies (PIAAC)</u> reveal troubling trends, including declining literacy levels and widening inequalities in many countries. These results highlight significant disparities in access to education and opportunities for skill development among adults, with vulnerable populations disproportionately affected.

For ICAE, the results underscore the critical role of adult learning and education (ALE) in addressing these challenges. By promoting lifelong learning as a human right, ALE can help bridge skill gaps, reduce inequalities, and foster social inclusion. The data also emphasizes the importance of resilient education systems that can adapt to the needs of diverse learners in a rapidly changing world.

The European Association for the Education of Adults (EAEA) and the European Basic Skills Network (EBSN) have expressed deep concern over these findings, highlighting the urgent need for comprehensive lifelong learning strategies. They advocate for stronger governance, increased investment, and innovative approaches to adult education to promote equality, social inclusion, and competitiveness. strengthen adult education systems globally to support individuals and societies in achieving their full potential.

- 3. **Spread the Word:** Share this invitation with relevant networks and stakeholders to broaden participation.


